- Lay theories of how to combat extremist violence often fail Counter narratives, empathy, etc
- Theory of Integrative Complexity (Suedfeld)
   Variations in IC as a function of relation between groups
- Could this be the basis of an intervention?
- IC alone is not enough
   Social Identity Theory (Tajfel & Turner)
   The role of affect
- Successful intervention: impact on metacognition & emotional control

## Relevance to Rebuilding Macro

- Theorising the intervention → Zero-Sum Mindsets (PAF next)
   Perception, Comprehension, Action
- Social Identity Theory (see Shayo Ann Rev Econ 2019)
   Not just a demographic variable
   A psychological structure & process -- cognitive and affective
- Values & symbolic goods
- Temporal considerations
- Importance & difficulties of translational research
- Policy or action?

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### WHAT IS A MINDSET?

An implicit theory about the essential nature of reality that can shape perceptions, strategies and behaviors that reinforce the mindset.

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
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#### ZERO-SUM MINDSET

In a zero-sum game, gains for one party are earned at the direct expense of another such that all winnings and losses sum to zero. Zero-sum mindset is an implicit, generalised belief that *life is a zero-sum game*.

#### Zero-Sum Mindset predicts Zero-Sum Beliefs Across Domains

e.g. "When one person gets a job it means someone else loses a job"



### LIFE IN A ZERO-SUM WORLD

People with a zero-sum mindset see the world as characterised by fixed scarcity, competition, hostility, and hierarchy.




## **ZERO-SUM GAME Possible Outcomes** (Finite & Discrete) I WIN YOU LOSE OR YOU WIN **I LOSE**

## Perception of hostility in ambiguous situations

Zero-sum mindset positively predicts hostile attribution bias. Also holds when controlling for sex, race, age, income.

"An ideal society requires some groups to be on top and others to be on the bottom."


## SOCIAL DOMINANCE ORIENTATION



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


## Cooperative (vs. Competitive) Strategy Bias


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


Zero-sum mindset predicts smaller "pie" (total value created) and less equitable distributions in dictator/public goods game

#### Zero-Sum Mindset predicts lower trust across domains












## CHANGE IN INCOME OVER TIME



- Zero-Sum Mindset
- ◆ Non-Zero-Sum Mindset

Zero-sum mindset at timepoint 1 predicts lower income at timepoint 2, controlling for income at timepoint 1. N = 353,  $\beta = -.07$ , \*\* = p < .01
